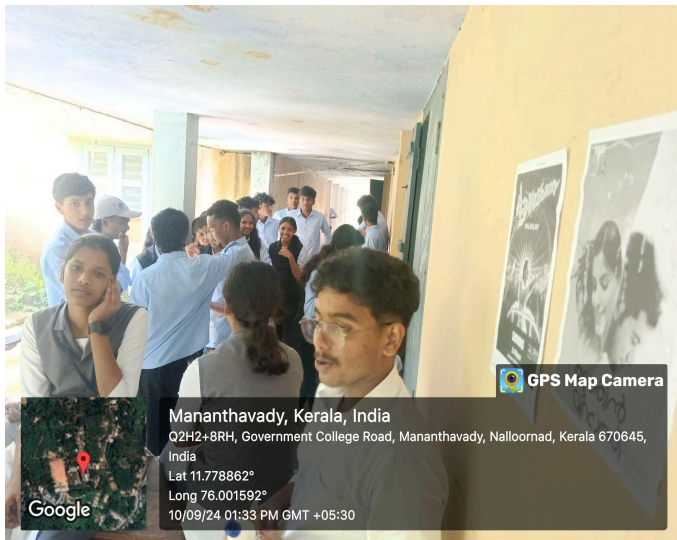


## 10/09/2024 - Film Festival

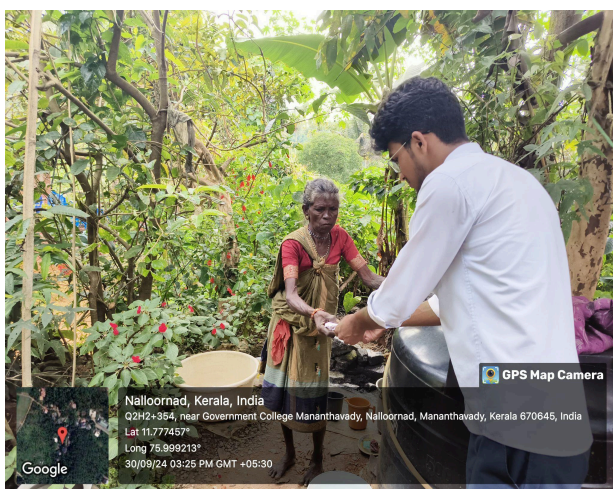


## 30/09/2024- Colony Sanitation

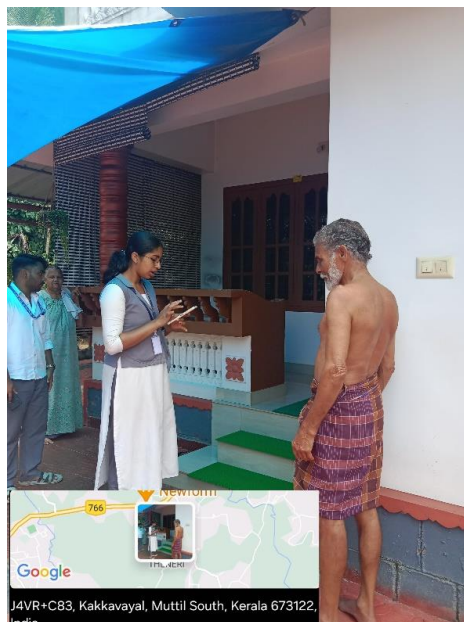

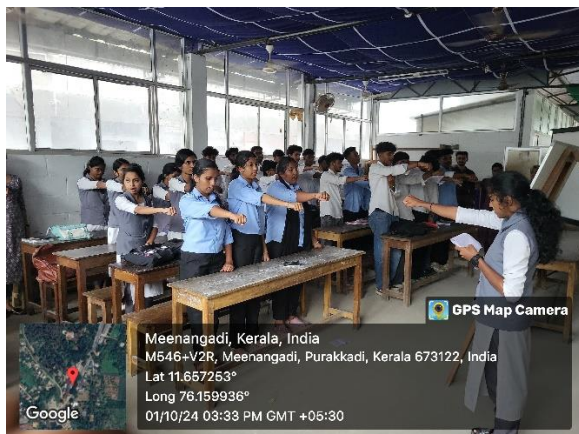
## **28/09/2024 - Swachata hi seva**
